

## **TERTIARY APPLICATION GUIDELINE FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**

1. Complete the *Hillary Outdoors International Student Application Form*  
<https://forms.gle/5VPqX5pVzD17AkrQ7>
2. Gather photocopies of the following documents
  - a. Academic record
  - b. English Language test results achieved within the last 2 years
  - c. A verified copy of your passport showing personal details
3.

5. Applications for Tertiary Courses are received from July. All applicants who meet the entry criteria are eligible for selection. The application is acknowledged and then a request for references is made. Online interviews for eligible applicants occur monthly.
6. If successful in being offered a place, Hillary Outdoors will email you a 'Letter of Offer'. This will include the following information:
  - a. The name of the course
  - b. Any conditions, for example, English language requirement
  - c. Start and finish dates for the course; duration of the course
  - d. The tuition fees for the course
  - e. Medical and travel insurance details
  - f. Details on how to pay Hillary Outdoors

Before you get a 'Visa in Principle' from New Zealand Immigration Service you will be required to send the letter of offer with your visa application.
7. To confirm your place on the course you will need to pay a minimum deposit of 10% of the course fee. This must be paid within 7 days of written confirmation of acceptance.
8. Students enrolled in the one year New Zealand Certificate in Outdoor and Adventure Education (multi-skilled) Level 4 or New Zealand Diploma in Outdoor and Adventure Education (multi-skilled) Level 5 programmes will need to obtain a student visa or permit to study in New Zealand. Complete the following steps to obtain your visa.

You will need to create a user account through RealMe – a secure online ID that allows you to login to a wide range of New Zealand Government services using a single username and password.

- b. Using the various filters on the website, you can establish what information and documentation you need to supply with your application.
  - c. Electronically submit your application form with the required documentation and required application fee.
9. The New Zealand Immigration Service will consider your application. You will be advised by the New Zealand Immigration Service:
  - a. That you have been granted a 'Visa in Principle' and a list of what actions you must now take, or
  - b. That you have been refused a visa, or
  - c. That the New Zealand Immigration Service requires you to provide more information. Please consider this letter carefully. You may discuss the additional requirements with Hillary Outdoors.
10. The Visa in Principle letter will require that you transmit funds to Hillary Outdoors. You should arrange through a bank to electronically transmit the funds to Hillary Outdoors' Public Trust bank account. The account number details are in your original letter of offer.
11. When Hillary Outdoors has checked that your transmitted funds have been received by the bank, Hillary Outdoors will send to you a Public Trust receipt confirming the amount of funds that have been received from you.
12. When you receive this letter, send or take it and your passport to the New Zealand Immigration Service. They will then issue you with the student visa in your passport. A copy of your Student Visa is to requirement for your Hillary Outdoors enrolment.
13. When you receive your passport back you may make your travel arrangements to fly to New Zealand.
14. You must also purchase travel and medical insurance for your stay in New Zealand. This insurance must cover to and from their country of origin or citizenship before their educational instruction begins and after it ends (which may be outside of the enrolment period). Hillary Outdoors requires a copy of this policy one month before commencement of your course. See Medical and Travel Insurance guidelines (handout).
15. Course are non-residential and you must make your own arrangements for your accommodation and travel within New Zealand. Contact us if you require more information.
